PASTOR'S PARISHABLES

"We all need an eagle." The gospel text last Sunday included the familiar promise of Jesus, "I am going to prepare a place for you. I will come back again & take you to myself, so that where I am you also may be" (John 14:2-3). That brought to mind the eagle in the old fable,



"The Eagle & the Wren" in which the eagle carried the wren to heights totally beyond the wren's ability to reach. The modern retelling I used is by Jane Goodall who in an afterword commented, "We all

need an eagle." Sunday's gospel included the phrase, "I am the way, the truth & the life. No one comes to the Father except through me."

One thing leads to another: The text led to the fable which led back to the beloved hymn "On Eagle's Wings": "And he will raise you up on eagle's wings, bear you on the breath of dawn...." And that song in turn led back to Scripture & its many mentions of eagles, starting with Psalm 91: "God will rescue from the fowler's snare..., will shelter you with pinions, spread wings that you may take refuge." From there the eagle trail led to Exodus 19:2-4: "While Israel was encamped ... in front of the mountain, Moses went up the mountain to God Then the Lord called to him & said, "Thus shall you say to the ... Israelites: You have seen for yourselves how I treated the Egyptians & how I bore you up on eagle wings & brought you here to myself." From there we went to Deuteronomy 32:11 in the Song of Moses, at the end of his life before the Jordan crossing: "As an eagle incites its nestlings forth by hovering over its brood, So he spread his wings to receive them & bore them up on his pinions". The prophets too speak in these terms, like Jeremiah referring to God "like an eagle ... soaring aloft, spreading its wings" (Jeremiah 49:22). When Isaiah proclaims the power of God to save he says, "They that hope in the Lord will renew their strength, they will soar as with eagles' wings; They will run & not grow weary, walk & not grow faint" (Isaiah 40:31). Yes, we all need an eagle, & God has given us one.

War's Catholic Ministries Appeal, 7 more parishioners at SS Peter & Paul pushed us to \$16,678! That's 102% of our \$16,310 goal! From 54 donors (18.6% of us). At St. Mary's we're still climbing too: This week we're at \$3,055 or 52.6% of our goal. That's from 22 donors (23% of us). I'm especially glad to see that almost ¼ of us at St. Mary's are responding. This is a sure sign of good morale & engagement in a parish. I'm proud of both parishes. This is Church support in the best sense of the word & a sign of serious & committed communities of faith who see beyond our own parishes.

"Goshfather"?! That heading recently in the *Tribune* got my attention, enough for me read the whole advice column: Q: Recently, a close friend & his wife, who are Catholic, asked me to be the godfather to their child. I reminded them that I am an atheist. My children weren't baptized & my

understanding is that a godparent is a religious mentor. Although I am not catholic, religious or spiritual, I would be delighted to be a mentor, close confidant, friend, uncle, etc to the child. Nonetheless, I still wonder if it's appropriate for me to be a godfather.

I would have my answer (& the Church's). I was curious what the advice columnist's would be. She said, "First there is this: Catholic Church canon [law] says a godparent will '...help the baptized to lead a Christian life in harmony with baptism, & to fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it.' If you are not comfortable with that, it would be most ethical to decline. If you are comfortable participating in the baptism service &, occasionally, other Church services, & if you feel able to fulfill this role for the child, then you should accept. The second hurdle is the Church itself. Christian churches differ regarding the godparent role & rite. But a Catholic priest might not be willing to administer this rite to a nonbeliever. Your friend should check with his priest. If you are NOT comfortable fulfilling religious-oriented role as a godfather, you should thank your friend for this honor. Ask him if you can be given an alternate status, whereby you will forge a special friendship with the child. Perhaps you could be the Goshfather—a special friend & honorary uncle."

Her answer brought a number of things to mind:

- "Goshfather"?? Now that's one I've never heard. I guess I'm just keeping up! (I haven't heard of Jinco either, or heard "Crush".) Actually, I kind of like it, but I could never say it with a straight face.
- There's certainly a lot in her response about being "comfortable". I'd be more comfortable using the word "capable" instead, as in "If you are not 'capable' of fulfilling the role…." (Or is that too bold?? or is this too sarcastic?)
- "A priest might not be willing to administer this rite to a nonbeliever" "Might not"? No, "would not;" "could not". (Also, "rite" is a generic word; "sacrament" is specific & what baptism is.)
- "If you feel comfortable participating in the baptism" That'd be like me taking the 1st step of the 12-step AA program—I'm not "uncomfortable" taking it; I just can't. (It'd be like me saying I'm a Methodist—comfortably or uncomfortably. Nothing against Methodists; I'm just not one.)
- "religious oriented role"? I think you can take your Careful Gloves off & just boldly say "religious role"; that's what it is so let's go ahead & say it. (Is it just me or was that a very "cautious" response in the advice column?)
