PASTOR'S PARISHABLES

Bishop Quinn said to all of the priests of our diocese this week: Dear Brothers, During the past few weeks, there has been shocking news concerning the sexual abuse of minors, of efforts by bishops to conceal the truth and revelations concerning immoral behavior by a cardinal, that has rocked our Church and far beyond. All of us are profoundly shocked because of the evil done to the victims of clergy sexual abuse.

Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, has issued a forceful and challenging letter to the People of God on August, 20, 2018, addressing the crimes and sins by clergy and the failure of Church leaders to protect children, minors and the vulnerable. This letter should serve as an examination of conscience for all of us and be a path forward.

It's most helpful.]

Please know, I recognize dear brothers, that you are doing Christ's work every day and are asked to stand in the shadow of the Cross and bear the brunt of the shock and the pain of our people who are deeply scandalized and hurt. I remain with you as a brother in prayer and in fraternity as the Holy Spirit guides the Church.

Why go to school? Why study? What do you want to know? Why do you want to know that? St. Bernard seemed to be addressing those very questions in a statement he made once about knowledge & a student's motivation in seeking it. (His feast day was just this past Monday, August 20.) These are timely thoughts with so many students heading back to school these late-summer days. The following reflection is from a sermon of St. Bernard on the Canticle of Canticles:

There are some who desire knowledge merely for its own sake; & that is shameful curiosity. And there are others who desire to know, in order that they may themselves be known; & that is vanity, disgraceful too. Others, again, desire knowledge in order to acquire money or status by it; that too is a discreditable quest. But there are also some who desire knowledge, that they may build up the souls of others with it; & that is charity. Others, again, desire it that they may themselves be built up thereby; & that is prudence. Of all these types, only the last two put knowledge to the right use."

A person's motives can make or break any endeavor. A bad motive—or simply a self-centered one—can spoil a good work. St. Bernard mentions <u>5</u> motives for scholar-

ship, only the last two being worthy: 1. mere curiosity, 2. vanity, 3. monetary, 4. charity, 5. prudence. (I might ask, isn't it prudent to want to make money to earn a living??) Food for thought—about our motives about many things. *Jesus'* knowledge was the knowledge of *God*, gained in cultivating a relationship with God through prayer. He certainly used that knowledge "to build up the souls of others." God bless all students returning to school these days, & God bless those charged with teaching them. May their motives too be only the purest: loving & prudent.

The feast of the Passion of St. John the Baptist is this coming Wednesday, August 29. Some years back in a St. John's *Looseleaf Lectionary* commentary, I read the following, & kept it. This "builds up my soul," as St. Bernard says; maybe it will yours also. (1st you should read the text of this grisly story in Mark 6:17-29.)

This is more than a gruesome, inspiring story of martyrdom. As Mark unfolds this story, it is evident in its details that he was preparing his readers for Jesus' death:

- <u>Herodias, like the chief priests</u>, plots the execution in devious ways, afraid of what the people might do.
- <u>Herod, like Pilate</u>, does the condemning even though he doesn't really believe it's the right thing to do.
- <u>Followers of John, like the disciples of Jesus</u>, take & bury John's body.
- When Herod hears about Jesus, he is afraid that it is John raised up, when in fact Jesus has been raised up. Mark wanted his readers to be like John: preparing others for the challenge of Jesus in their lives. Mark's concern seems to have been that his Christian community live in such a way that when people observed them, they would think that Jesus had come back to life.

There is interest in the Catholic Church out there on the part of some who are not Catholic, or who once were & would like to return or would like to be confirmed. RCIA—Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults—is the acronym we use for the process of catechesis, formation & reception of non-Catholics into the Catholic Church. It is very flexible & can be done to fit the needs of those interested. We'll start in the early fall. Call us if you'd like to be a part of this.
