The "Eternal Rest" prayer & the Litany of the Saints prayer (some version of it) are naturals this month.

The Scriptures of All Saints Day have been used for centuries: the beginning of Jesus' sermon on the mount with the celebrated beatitudes; the passage from 1 John about our status as children of God (whom the world does not recognize, who will one day be revealed to be like Christ); & ... a vision. The vision of All Saints Day is part of the vision of St. John from the Book of Revela-tion, the part including the great multitude, the 144,000, the "survivors", the blessed, all dressed in white.

The vision of St. John brings to mind "The Vision of Sir Launfal," a poem & parable by James Russell Lowell. (The name of the knight in the poem is the name of a knight of the Round Table of Arthurian legend.) Almost the whole of that poem is a telling of a vision that was visited upon a knight who planned, after a good night's sleep, to embark on a quest for the Holy Grail. When he awoke, with the vision still fresh, Sir Launfal abandoned his plan because he'd learned in the night that that famous sacred chalice is not an antique from the past but the cup he had used—in his vision—in relieving the misery of a suffering leper. In his vision, he had found the Holy Grail in his charity & compassion.

Instead of the glorious & noble "quest for the Holy Grail," he returns to his castle & life a changed man. It was because of what he saw in a leper, according to the vision, & heard the leper say. This revelation from the leper & in the leper came in the vision after it described a selfish man on a noble but unsuccessful mission that

consumed his life, summarized in the poem as taking him from June to December. Like bookends of his vision was a leper, scorned by Sir Launfal in his youth, at the beginning of his quest, but at the end recognized by the knight, now a humbler & broken man: And Sir Launfal said,--"I behold in thee/ An image of Him who died on the tree;/ Thou also hast had thy crown of thorns,--/ Thou also hast had the world's buffets and scorns,--/ And to thy life were not denied/ The wounds in the hands and feet and side:/ Mild Mary's Son, acknowledge me;/ Behold, through him, I give to thee!"

And what Sir Launfal gave was a crust of bread & a bowl of water from a nearby stream. Now, in the knight's eyes, the leper is transformed (even as the knight is): As Sir Launfal mused with a downcast face,/ A light shone round about the place; The leper no longer crouched at his side,/ But stood before him glorified,/ Shining and tall and fair and straight/ As the pillar that stood by the Beautiful Gate,--/ Himself the Gate whereby men can/ Enter the temple of God in Man./ His words were shed softer than leaves from the pine,/ And they fell on Sir Launfal as snows on the brine, / Which mingle their softness and quiet in one/ With the shaggy unrest they float down upon;/ And the voice that was calmer than silence said,/ "Lo, it is I, be not afraid!/ In many climes, without avail,/ Thou had spent thy life for the Holy Grail;/ Behold, it is here,--this cup which thou/ Didst fill at the streamlet for me but now;/ This crust is my body broken for thee,/ This water His blood that died on the tree;/ The Holy Supper is kept, indeed,/ In whatso we share with another's need,--/ Not that which we give, but what we *share,--/ For the gift without the giver is bare;/ Who* bestows himself with his alms feeds three,--/ Himself, his hungering neighbor, and me."

**In our annual Catholic Ministries Appeal**, I notice that as a diocese we have reached <u>96.7% of our goal so far</u> (\$2,029,763 of \$2,100,000). Here at home, these are the current numbers:

<u>SS PP</u>: 70 (25.6%) have given \$14,245 (82.3%) of goal. <u>St M</u>: 23 (29.5%) have given \$ 3,800 (62.4%) of goal.

"It's Worse than We Think" is the title of a September 3 editorial in the Jesuit America magazine, the 1<sup>st</sup> half of which I printed here last week. Today I intended to print the other half but as you can see I'm out of space. It's worth reading & rereading. The numbers alone are shocking: Nationwide, I in 5 girls & 1 in 12 boys are sexually abused before their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday. 95% of boys & girls are abused by someone they know. 50% of victims between 1 – 6 & 25% of victims 12 – 17 are abused by a member of their own family. 84% of child sexual abuse occurs in homes. In 2014, 1.8 million adolescents in the U.S. were victims of a sexual assault. I promise the other half soon (or you may look it up for yourself on the internet).
